if you would like an appointment. She gives advice about headlice and is happy to do this at anytime. If we see a child has headlice we will speak to the child's parent immediately to ask them to treat the child. The rest of the class will receive a letter so parents are aware that there is a problem and check their child's hair.

We can treat children's hair if parents give consent but it is parents' responsibility to ensure their child's hair is treated.

Medical needs

If your child has a medical need or condition can you let the school office know so it can be recorded on our system, that way all staff who need to need specialised training. We also need to know any changes that may occur immediately. A care plan may need to be made with the school nurse and staff may need additional training.
