If you would like to see our school nurse please see Donna Blacklock who will book an appointment for you. She gives advice about headlice and is happy to do this at anytime. The rest of the class will receive a letter so parents are aware that there is a problem and check their child's hair. We can treat children's hair if parents give consent but it is parents' responsibility to ensure their child's hair is treated.


### **Medical Needs**
