The builders will be working on the extension and refurbishment for between 9 and 12 months. # **Bridgewater's Got Talent**


Live show took place on Tuesday and despite

# School Nurse Drop in

The school nurse has a fortnightly drop in session at school every other Wednesday 2.45 to 3.15pm. If you have any

concerns please drop in for a chat. She gives advice about **headlice** and is happy to do this at anytime. If we see a child has headlice we will speak to the child's parent immediately to ask them to treat the child. The rest of the class will receive a letter so parents are aware that there is a problem and check their child's hair. **We can treat children's hair if parents give consent but it is parents' responsibility to ensure their child's hair is treated.** 

#### Medical needs

If your child has a medical need or condition can you let the school office know so it can be recorded on our SIMs system, that way all staff who need to know will. A care plan may need to be made with the school nurse and staff may need specialised training. We also need to know any changes that may occur
