#### Family support worker (cost £27233)

75 children, 96.6% pupil premium –89.5% in reading, 89% in writing and 91% in maths made accelerated progress.

Attendance work, first response, home visits involvement of other services. Family Support, liaises with other agencies, accompanies parents to meetings with other agencies. Sets up programmes for vulnerable children. Attendance rose to 95.5%

**Reading intervention** – 0.3 teacher **(cost £11,316)**, 1-1 Reading intervention based on Reading Recovery for three Y1 children daily (85% accelerated progress) 80% pupil premium.

**Maths intervention** -0.3 teacher **(cost £11,316)**, 1-2 maths programme for two Y2 children daily (86% accelerated progress) 12 children accessed the programme, 80% were pupil premium.

**1-1 Tuition -**26 children, 100 % accelerated progress, 87 % pupil premium (cost £8042)

**Breakfast club staffing & resources** (up to 120 children daily) **– £16,000**, 84% in reading, 86% in writing and 84% in maths made better than expected progress

Additional English as an Additional Language support – £7605, 86% in reading, 84% in writing and 86% in maths made better than expected progress.

Outstanding teaching programme & additional CPD for staff - to develop whole class teaching and learning - £4813 (supply costs not included) – 100% made better than expected progress. Also see year group figures.

## **Impact**

- Pupils eligible for Pupil Premium have shown accelerated progress this year in all classes and in some cases greater progress than other groups.
- All groups are narrowing gaps with national figures.
- Year 2 and Y6 SATs showed that all groups of children achieved positive results in 2014/15, closing the gap and some exceeding the national average.
- The school was judged outstanding in all areas by Ofsted

The Pupil Premium for 2015-16 is allocated to local authorities and schools with pupils on roll in January 2015 that are known to have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any time in the last six years. Each of these pupils will attract £1300. Schools will have the freedom to spend the Premium, which is additional to the underlying schools budget, in a way they think will best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils. Our grant is £241,400 for 2015/16

The targeted and strategic use of pupil premium will support us in achieving our vision. We will allocate the pupil premium for 2014/15 using the following principles:

# **Principles**

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils.
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged. At least 70% of any group will be made up of FSM children.
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis
  which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited
  funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school
  meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time.

The pupil premium will be used in 2015/16 partly in line with 2014/15 due to evidence of impact. Additional provision and interventions will be funded which will support children facing deprivation to accelerate their learning.
