End of Year Report

2016 -2017



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We are the Turtles Class! What another busy year and we all wanted to tell you what we have been up to.

Currently we have 30 children in our class. There are 21 boys and 9 girls. We come from all over the world including Egypt, China, Sudan, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Slovakia, Afghanistan and not forgetting the UK. 50% of our class speak English as a second language.

In our first half term, we followed a curriculum very similar to Reception. This meant that we could develop the key skills of reading, writing and maths — everyday, for every child. This helped the children catch up from their summer dip and develop independence.

Read Write Inc (RWI)



As part of a whole school project, all the staff have been taught to teach reading, writing and spellings through RWI. It aims to develop children to be accurate and speedy readers. We are taught in small, ability groups where we move through the programme at our own pace and are taught sounds and words to support us. Each day we have a 1 hour session which includes speed sounds, reading and Get Writing.

Praise

We learn quickly in a positive climate. "I like the actions. My favourite is 'High five suba dive'"

Pace

Good pace is essential to the lesson. It is lively and structured and this has helped to keep us all engaged.



Partner Work

We love the partner work and it is important to remember to never give up! We noticed that children were more confident in



answering and expressing their ideas. With the chance to read to a partner every session, their reading has improved and they have enjoyed the fun of holding and building a sentence, which helped to improve writing content.

Each term we have had a new topic.

This Is Me and Where I Live

This was our first topic. We looked at our bodies and named parts of our bodies. We talked about our senses, linked these to parts of our body, and carried out a senses walk around the school grounds. We looked at the area in which we live, used maps, and talked about the different human and physical features of our locality. We have a great view of the River Tyne from our classroom veranda and the children could explore what they could see.

Castles

After Christmas we learnt about castles. We looked at the battle of Hastings and King Harolds life and compared castles from then to castles now. We considered the purpose of castles, how they have changed and how they were defended throughout the ages. We studied historical castles in our area and used maps to locate them. We made moving pictures. "My knight moves on a slider" Nyle.



Plants and Animals

We were amazed to find out we eat some types of plants. We have planted sunflower seeds and are watching them grow! We have enjoyed answering questions like "What types of tress grow at Bridgewater?"

Seasons

As part of science, we have been studying the seasons each term. We have observed and discussed the changes and identified how the weather changed too. Over the year we have been writing our own non-fiction book about the seasons. We have included line drawing, collages, and pictures created on the computers.

Autumn

We went for an autumn walk around the school grounds to look for signs of Autumn. We collected different coloured leaves and talked about how and why the leaves change. We used the leaves to design a piece of artwork in the style of the artist Andy Goldsworthy.

Winter

It snowed for a few hours one morning and we took the opportunity to learn about winter. We wrote acrostic poems and drew trees — using lines of different thickness.



Spring

During Spring, we went on a flower hunt as part of our Plants and Seeds topic. The children found different varieties of flowers and wild flowers around school and in our forest area. They created a tally chart to find the most and least common flowers in our school environment. We have also planted sunflower seeds which are growing slowly and the children are learning how to take care of plants. We looked at Van Gogh's Sunflower picture and did our own observational drawing.

Summer

We are busy learning about summer now! We have begun to talk about the changes from Spring to Summer and will be learning about the weather and how to keep ourselves summer safe as the long summer holiday approaches.

Broxfield Farm.

We were very lucky earlier in the year to have a visit from Mr
Thompson, the owner of Broxfield Farm. He came in to talk to the
children about seasonal changes of the farm and the different crops he
has. He brought seeds and oats for the children to explore and the
children were able to ground the oats to make flour. We then visited his
Farm in March where the children fed the cows, did rain dances in the



field and went on a scavenger hunt in a small forest area. We were also visited by two baby lambs from a neighbouring farm and the children were very lucky to be able to bottle feed them.
