# General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) for Parent/Carers

Along with other organisations across the UK, we are busy preparing for the change to Data Protection Law which is due to take place on 25th May 2018.

Below please find a simple guide which tells you about how we are working to meet this new regulation which will give more control to individuals and more responsibilities to organisations that collect and hold your data.

Our school already has strict data protection policies, but these will be updated to reflect the changes needed to meet GDPR.

Our data is already kept secure and used appropriately, but we will be giving you specific information about this through our updated Privacy Notice and Freedom of Information Policy.

Much of what we do with data will stay the same, but with GDPR there will be more security and transparency.

Schools have a duty to keep children safe and to deliver a high standard of education so much of our data is held and processed for the reason of 'carrying out the public task of providing a state-funded education'. When we require your consent, you will be asked for it in a clear and easy to understand way and you will have the right to remove your consent at any time. Our organisation holds the following data: pupil education records, pupil medical information, parent contact information, parent details which enable us to check for Free School Meal qualification or 30 hours nursery qualification, safeguarding records, special needs records and school meals data. The Governing Body and our Data

Protection Officer will be holding the school to account to ensure that we are meeting our GDPR responsibilities. We will keep you informed about GDPR. If you have any questions, please ask at the School Office.

#### SATs

This week Year 6 are doing their SATs.
These are important tests and the children have worked

incredibly hard to prepare for them. Lots of children even came to school in the Easter holidays to do extra work to make sure they were ready to show their best. Most children also do tuition after school which helps them to focus on their targets and get better at things they have found tricky. Everyone will be pleased when the SATs are over and we hope that all of Year 6 get the fantastic results that they deserve for having a great attitude to their learning and working their socks off!

#### **Year 6 Science**



This half term in science Year 6 have been learning all about the circulatory system. They have found about the jobs of the heart, lungs and

blood vessels and how blood travels around our bodies. During one lesson they made fake blood. They used different items to represent the different parts of blood. For example, they used red food colouring and Cheerios for red blood cells and marshmallows for white blood cells. They also learned about plasma and platelets (which help blood to clot). It was very messy but lots of fun!

#### Holiday fines

Just a reminder that we need holiday forms completed for any child taking time off during term time. No holidays will be authorised and parents will be fined if their child's absence exceeds 4.5 days (which is 10 sessions or more).

The rest of the class will receive a letter so parents are aware that there is a problem and check their child's hair. We can treat children's hair if parents give consent but it is parents' responsibility to ensure their child's hair is treated.


#### **Medical Needs**
