#### **The Chronicle**

#### Clockwork

Year 6 are enjoying reading a book called 'Clockwork' by Philip Pullman in their English

lessons. This is an exciting story where each part is told from a different characters' perspective. The children have enjoyed working in groups to study the different characters in more detail and have created descriptions, letters, comic strips and are now working on newspaper reports. It has inspired some children to read other books by Philip Pullman.

## Year of the Rat

We have been learning about Chinese New Year this week and celebrated with a special lunch at lunchtime.

Our **school council** are working with the Trust council to reduce the amount of litter in the local area and look at how we can help prevent global warming.

#### Y5 Science



In science we have been studying about reversible and irreversible changes and we've been looking at materials that are soluble and insoluble when mixed

with water. We have been doing many investigations to see what materials would be soluble and insoluble in the water and looking at mixtures that cause a reaction and create an irreversible change. We found that in water sugar



was soluble and we could use evaporation to separate the sugar from the water. We also found that a chemical

reaction happened when we added an effervescent vitamin tablet to water as gas came out from the vitamin and the water changed colour. This was an irreversible change was we could not get it back to different materials again. We have also made our own sieves to see what materials we could separate. By Emmanuella

#### After School Club

In our after school childcare the children have the opportunity to do fun activities, have a snack and there is time to get their homework done too. We are offering free taster sessions and there will be themed nights for children to come to. Children will also be taken on trips out. Remember to make sure we have up to date contact numbers for you in case we have to get in touch in an emergency. We also sent text messages to keep parents informed so it is vital our contact details are up to date.

## School Nurse Drop in

If you would like to see our school nurse please see Donna
Blacklock who will book an appointment for you. She gives advice about **headlice** and is

happy to do this at anytime. If we see a child has headlice we will speak to the child's parent immediately to ask them to treat the child. The rest of the class will receive a letter so parents are aware that there is a problem and check their child's hair. We can treat children's hair if parents give consent but it is parents' responsibility to ensure their child's hair is treated.

#### Medical Needs

If your child has a medical need or condition can you let the school office know so it can be recorded on our system, that way all staff who need to know will. A care plan may need to be made with the school nurse and staff may need specialised training. We also need to know any changes that may occur immediately.



All **money** paid into school should either be paid directly to the school office or through the class teacher in a labelled

envelope. This prevents any loss or confusion over money paid.
