What is the difference between a sign and a symbol?

Signs and symbols are pictures that represent something and have a meaning.

Signs	Symbols

Here are three Christian **symbol**s which can be understood by reading the story of Noah in the book of Genesis in the Bible.



The **rainbow** represents a reminder of God's promise.



The **olive branch** represents peace.

The **dove** represents peace.

Idioms and religious metaphors

These are phrases that have a non-literal or figurative meaning. They are often used in religious scripture to suggest a greater meaning about that religion's teachings. Metaphors are used in the bible: God is my rock (Psalm 18), Jesus is the light of the world (John 8), the Lord is my shepherd (Psalm 23). Foods can be used as symbols. Here is a picture of a Seder Plate which is used during the Jewish holiday of Passover. It holds six different foods, each with a special religious significance to the retelling of the Passover story (the exodus from Egypt)



Lamb shank bone is a reminder of the sacrifices the Jews had to make. Apple and nut mix charoset represents the mortar used to hold the buildings together.

Lettuce represents new life.

Parsley dipped in salt water to remember the tears of the slaves.

Hard boiled egg is a sign of Spring Horseradish is a reminder of the bitterness of slavery.
