Equator	an imaginary circle around Earth. It divides Earth into two equal parts: the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere.		
prime meridian	the imaginary line that divides Earth into two equal parts: the Eastern Hemisphere and the Western Hemisphere. It is the starting point for the measuring system called longitude.		
peninsula	a body of land surrounded by water on three sides. The word comes from the Latin, meaning "almost an island."		
culture	a pattern of behaviour shared by a society, or group of people. Many different things make up a society's culture. These things include food, language, clothing, tools, music, arts, customs, beliefs, and religion.		
economy	the system of how money is made and used within a particular country or region. A region's economy is connected with things like how many goods and services are produced and how much money people can spend on these things.
