MODERN MAYA.

A lot of artefacts were burned during this battle and some Mayans began to use less traditional Mayan ways such as, speaking and writing their language, farming and beliefs and adopted a European way of life.

Conclusion:

There are 1.2m– 6 million people who follow the Mayan philosophy and speak Mayan. Today and some Mayan tribes still live in the rainforest and practice traditional Mayan culture so the conquest did not destroy Mayan culture completely. However, even though many Mayan speak Spanish these days and follow a European way of life – I don't believe that Mayan culture has been completely destroyed as some of their traditional ways still exist today.
