
	This is what we're doing this term!
English	Reading Fiction stories such as Flat Stanley, Lighthouse Keeper stories, Hello Lighthouse, Non-Fiction— information texts, non-chronological reports. Practising handwriting joins, reading and spelling high frequency words and words from the Year 2 spelling list. Reading—Comprehension questions and activities linked to fiction and non- fiction texts. Daily Read Write Inc lessons—Reading texts for accuracy and fluency, answering comprehension questions, developing sight vocabulary. Writing sentences containing adjectives, adverbs and verbs. Learning how to use conjunctions such as because, that, if, so, but in their sentences. Using punctuation correctly e.g. capital letters, full stops, question marks, commas in a list, speech marks etc.

Mathematics	Number— counting in 2's, 3's, 5's and 10's., continuing learning our 2,3,5 and 10 times tables. Addition and subtraction of 2 digit numbers, calculating missing numbers in addition and subtraction calculations. Problem solving with money, measurements, length etc. Data handling—Collecting and grouping data, making graphs and charts. Time—Reading the time to o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. Reading the time to 5 past, 10 past, 20 past and 25 past the hour.
	Developing reasoning skills in the areas of the curriculum being taught.
Science	We will be learning about plants. We will be looking at the needs of plants and investigating the conditions that plants need to grow in. We will also be looking at the life cycles of certain plants such as sunflowers.
Computing	To learn how to use a search engine to find information on a specific subject, using keywords to narrow down our search results. We are going to use the information from our research sessions to make videos and sound recordings on an iPad to present our findings.
History	We will be looking at a significant local individual and their life—Grace Darling We will be looking at Grace Darling's rescue and the impact of this on our live: today.
Geography	We will be comparing Bamburgh in Northumberland to Lizard Island in Australia.
Music	During our In Harmony lessons, we will be learning how to use our bows to mak notes and also some new notes on our instruments and learning how to read different notes in a piece of music.
P.E.	Learning to develop our basic skills such as throwing, catching, different kinds of jumps, balances etc.
R.E.	To learn about Judaism beliefs and practices. To learn about ideas about God in Christianity and Judaism.
PSHE	To learn about the jobs that different people do and to learn about money, where money comes from and the different choices people can make about their money. We will also learn about how we recognise our feelings and the feelings of others.
Art D.T.	To create drawings and sketches using different shading techniques. We will be designing and making a t-shirt using a simple running stitch



## SOME REMINDERS

Start of the day - Both Year 2 classes start at 8.45am. Please arrive on time and not early or late.

The children will be collected from the top play yard by a member of staff. Please follow the one-way system in place when entering and leaving school. Children who miss even a few minutes of the school day can miss out on vital aspects of the curriculum as we start learning straight away.

**End of the day** - School finishes at **2.50pm (**Mon-Thurs) and 3:30 only on Fridays due to In Harmony. Please be prompt in collecting your child as Year 3 leave from the same doors at 3:00pm and Year 2 should have already have left the school premises by then. Please wait in a socially-distanced manner using the markings on the floor outside of the hall/gym doors.

## Penguins class leave through the hall (Mon, Tues, Thurs and Fri). <u>Penguins</u> leave through the link corridor on a Wed.

**Seals class leave through the gym every day.** Please remember to let a member of staff or the school office know if someone different is coming to collect your child as if we do not know them, we may be unable to let your child leave with them. In this situation, we will contact you via telephone to gain your permission before allowing your child to leave the premises. Children in year 2 must be collected by someone <u>over 16</u>.

We will send text messages and Classdojo messages to let you know when In Harmony is not on so please look out for them.

**Uniforms and Coats** - All children *must* wear school uniform at all times. A polite reminder that the uniform for Year 2 is a blue jumper/cardigan, a yellow polo shirt and black/grey trousers/skirt. Children are not allowed to wear leggings, jeans or tracksuit bottoms. Please make sure all uniform and coats are <u>clearly labelled</u> with your child's name.

**Shoes**—Please make sure your child is wearing sensible school shoes (i.e. NO heeled boots or shoes) and if they have laces, please teach them how to tie them themselves or alternatively make sure they wear Velcro shoes if they can't tie laces. This will help us greatly—Thank you.

**Reading** - Reading folders will be sent home every day and we ask that each child reads <u>every</u> night at home some/all of their book. Please make sure that your child's book folder is in school each day to allow members of staff to hear your child read. Reading is an important part of the curriculum and therefore we encourage you to spend time reading with your child and ask you to sign their reading record (yellow book) every time you do this.

If your child is reading Read Write Inc books, they will be changed after they have been read 3 times either at home or in school. This is to help your child gain fluency when reading. If your child has moved onto book banded books (Coloured sticker on spine of book) then these will be changed after they have been read once.

## SOME REMINDERS

PE— Penguins have P.E. on a Thursday every week. Seals have P.E. on a Tuesday every week.

P.E. is outdoors every week unless the weather is unsuitable for an outdoor lesson. Please remember to send your child into school with their tracksuit bottoms and trainers in a bag for the lesson. They can also bring a suitable hoodie or sweatshirt if they wish or just wear their school jumper. Once the weather becomes warmer we will just wear our school P.E. kits but some days it may be too cold for t-shirts and shorts. We wear coats to walk to the P.E. area if it is cold and then the children are encouraged to leave them on for the lesson itself. If they get hot then they are allowed to take them off.

**Jewellery**— A reminder that the only earrings that are allowed to be worn in school are small stud earrings and these <u>MUST NOT</u> be worn on P.E. days. Please make sure they are taken out on the day your child has P.E. NO other jewellery should be worn.

**Homework** - Homework and spellings will be given on a Friday for both classes via Class Dojo. Homework is normally set on Education City and each child has their own log in. Spellings are posted on Class Dojo portfolios with instructions of the date of the spelling test.

**Classdojo**—We use Classdojo to send messages to all parents on our class story section. We are also posting homework instructions and spellings on there every week too. Please make sure you are regularly checking Class Dojo so you don't miss out on important information.

If your child is absent or self-isolating, their school work will be posted on Class Dojo daily and they are expected to complete it and post it on their portfolio for us to see. The portfolio post will be approved and we will provide feedback on the work completed.

**Contact details**—Please make sure we have up to date contact details at the office for your child e.g. the correct phone number for parents, up to date address etc. This is especially important in case your child is unwell or has an accident and we need to urgently contact you. We also use text messages to let you know important dates etc.

**Face coverings**—A reminder that parents must wear face coverings while on school grounds and must observe social distancing at all times.

**SATs**—As you may already have seen on the national news, for 2021, the Year 2 SATs will NOT go ahead due to the disruption to education caused by the pandemic. There will therefore be no tests in May in Year 2 as there usually are.
