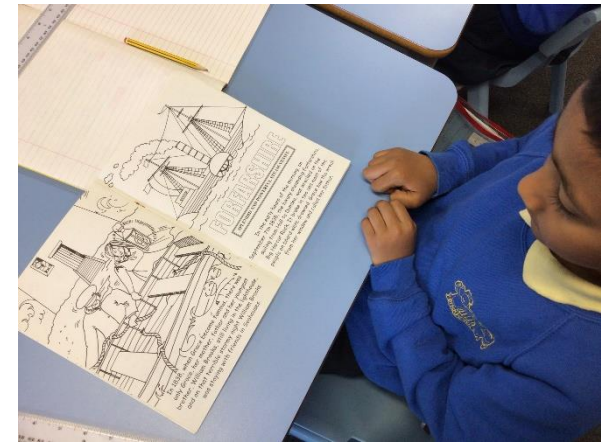


Year 2 Seals - Enquiry based learning - Summer 2021.

Beginning of the process

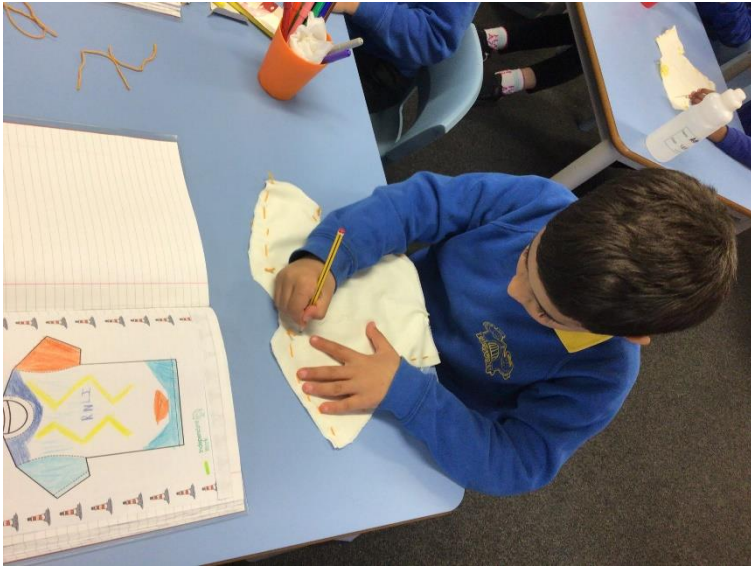

RNLI lighthouse engineer




A engineer can be a male or a female. They design and build the lighthouses. They need to check and fix the lighthouses. They need to be good at technology. They have to have good imagination. RNLI

The RNLI stands for the Royal National Lighthouse Institution. The RNLI has 3 different types of lighthouses. The first lighthouse is called the all weather lighthouse the second lighthouse is called the inshore lighthouse and the last lighthouse is called the hovercraft lighthouse. They patrol 365 days a year. They have saved over 142,000 lives since 1824. There is 95% of the RNLI are volunteers and only 5% get paid. There are 5,000 members.

RNLI lighthouse



The lighthouses work for the RNLI. It is a paid job or a volunteer role with a good wage. They save people who are in trouble in the sea, on the beach or on the cliffs. They always watch out the waves by using binoculars. They always carry equipment with them in every situation. They have to be a strong confident swimmer at times.
