SOME REMINDERS

Start of the day - Both Year 2 classes start at 8.50am

The children will be collected from the top play yard. The children are brought to their classroom by their teacher. Please follow the one-way system in place when leaving school. Please ensure that your child arrives on time, children who miss even a few minutes of the school day can miss out on vital aspects of the curriculum.

End of the day - School finishes at 3:00pm (Tues-Friday) and 3:30 only on Mondays starting 20/09/21. Please be prompt in collecting your child as Year 3 leave from the same doors at 3:10pm. Please wait in a socially-distanced manner using the markings on the floor outside of the hall/gym doors.

Penguins class leave through the hall. Seals class leave through the gym.

Please remember to let a member of staff know if someone different is coming to collect your child as if we do not know them, we may be unable to let your child leave with them.

Children in year 2 must be collected by someone over 16.

Uniforms and Coats - All children must wear school uniform at all times. A polite reminder that the uniform for Year 2 is a blue jumper/cardigan, a yellow polo shirt and black/grey trousers/skirt. Children are not allowed to wear leggings, jeans or tracksuit bottoms. Please make sure all uniform and coats are clearly labelled with your child's name.

Reading - Reading folders will be sent home every day and we ask that each child reads <u>every</u> night at home some/all of their book. Please make sure that your child's book folder is in school each day to allow members of staff to hear your child read. Reading is an important part of the curriculum and therefore we encourage you to spend time reading with your child and ask you to sign their reading record (yellow book) every time you do this.

PE - The Penguins class and the Seals classes have P.E. on a Tuesday. We ask that each child wears sensible shoes and brings in a pair of tracksuit bottoms/leggings as some of our sessions are outdoors.

Homework - Both classes receive their homework on a Friday, it should be returned by Thursday of the following week.

Toys from home: We discourage children bringing toys in from home as it can cause distress and disagreements. Please support us in this decision.

Due to the school closures last academic year, Year 2 children will take the Y1 Phonics Screen in December.

	This is what we're doing this term!
English	Looking at the author Shirley Hughes Reading fiction stories linked to our topic which is the Victorians and Queen Victoria Non-Fiction — reading and writing Instructions, recounts and persuasive letters. Poetry—Reading and performing various poems and writing our own poems. Practising handwriting joins, reading and spelling Year 2 words. Reading and writing interesting sentences using adjectives, adverbs and conjunctions.
Mathematics	Number—reading and writing 2 digit numbers up to 100, place value of numbers to 3 digits, addition and subtraction, counting in 2's,3's, 5's and 10's. Reasoning activities about place value. Learning our times table and related division facts for 2,3,5 and 10 times tables. Money—solving problems and giving change. Shape—Identifying 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. Data handling—Collecting and grouping data. Reading the time on an analogue clock to o'clock, half past, quarter past, quarter to.
Science	We will be investigating different materials and learning about their uses in every day life. Humans and animals – life cycles of common animals
Computing	Computer navigation skills using word processing software. Keyboard and mouse skills. Coding simple algorithms to command a sprite using Scratch Jnr. Using debug- ging skills to spot errors in a short algorithm.
Geography	We will be learning about our local area and how to identify areas on a map. We will be looking at human and physical features of our local area and their uses.
History	We will be looking at an events beyond living memory that are significant nationally/globally— Queen Victoria's reign. We will be looking at the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements—Queen Victoria.
Art & Design	We will be making 3D models linked to our Victorians topic and using collaging techniques to .
Music	Using musical instruments to compose and perform songs in small groups. Learning and singing songs linked to our topic. We will also begin In Harmony sessions this half term.
P.E.	This term we will be working with our P.E. coach, learning new and exciting skills. We will be focusing on multi skills e.g. jumping, throwing, catching, balancing and staying safe in the lesson.
R.E.	We will be looking at the stories of Jesus and ideas of belonging.
