
In Commando Joes we had to pass water safely from one part of the playground to the other, using pipes and lots of communication whilst working in our teams. They also made bridges in Commando Joes.

After School Club

In our after school childcare the children have the opportunity to do fun activities, have a snack and there is time to get their homework done too. If you are interested in applying for a place for your child please see Gillian Gibson our Extended Services Manager.

Remember to make sure we have up to date contact numbers for you in case we have to get in touch in an emergency. We also sent text messages to keep parents informed so it is vital our contact details are up to date. Please ensure you are signed up to class Dojo and let us know about permissions for photographs.

Medical Needs

If your child has a medical need or condition can you let the school office know so it can be recorded on our system, that way all staff who need to know will. A care plan may need to be made with the school nurse and staff may need specialised training. We also need to know any changes that may occur immediately.

All *money* paid into school should either be paid directly to the school office or through the class teacher in a labelled

envelope. This prevents any loss or confusion over money paid.
