Victorian teachers were very strict.

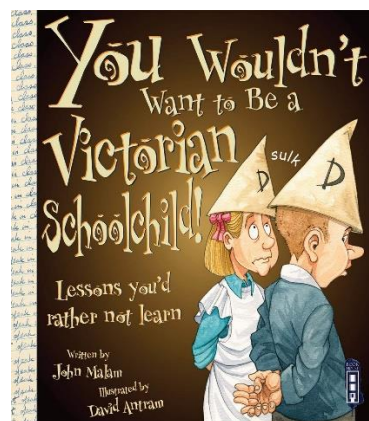
**Key vocabulary**

Prince Albert - Queen Victoria's husband

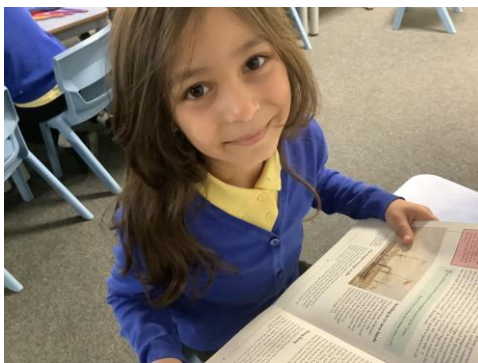
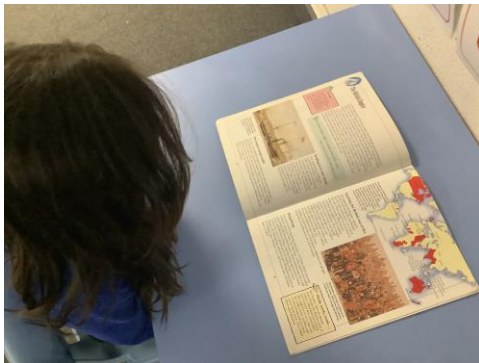
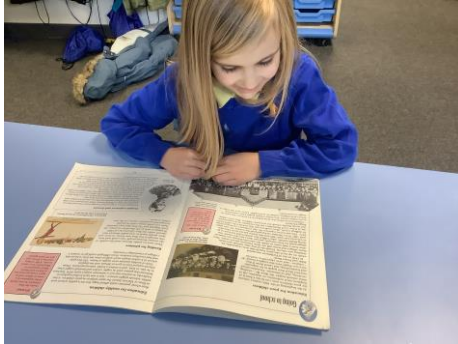
**Queen Victoria's Timeline**

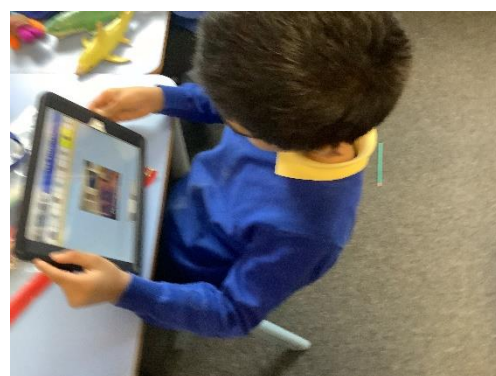
Next, we used the text "You Wouldn't want to be a Victorian Schoolchild" to promote interest in the learners.

Later, we used QR codes with preprogrammed webpages to find out about the teachers in Victorian schools

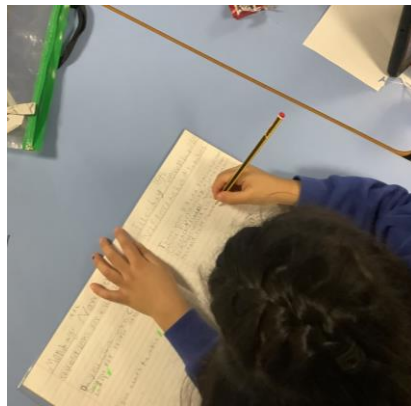


We then watched a lesson with a Victorian head teacher to find out what they were like.

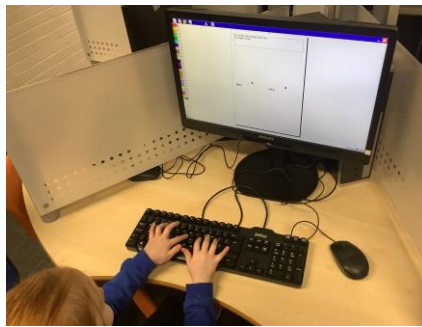
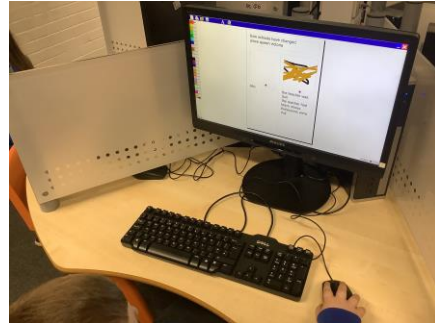
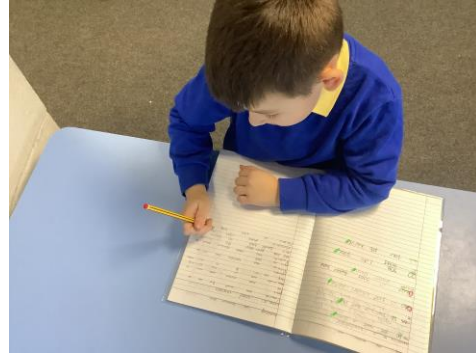
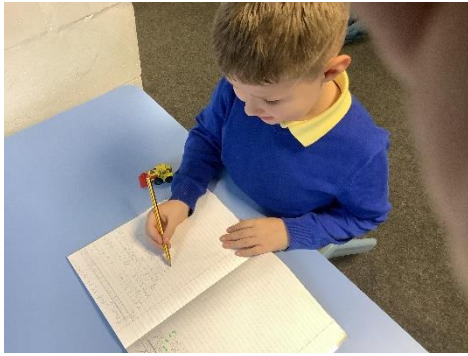




We compared what Victorian and modern head teachers were like and thought about the skills that both jobs need.



For our end products, we recorded our new knowledge into our English books as a first draft and then created our e-books.

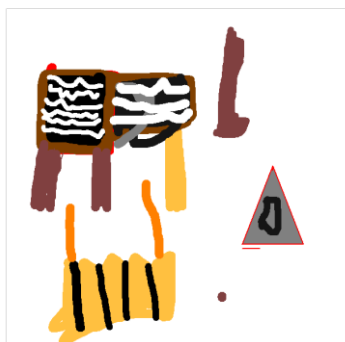
