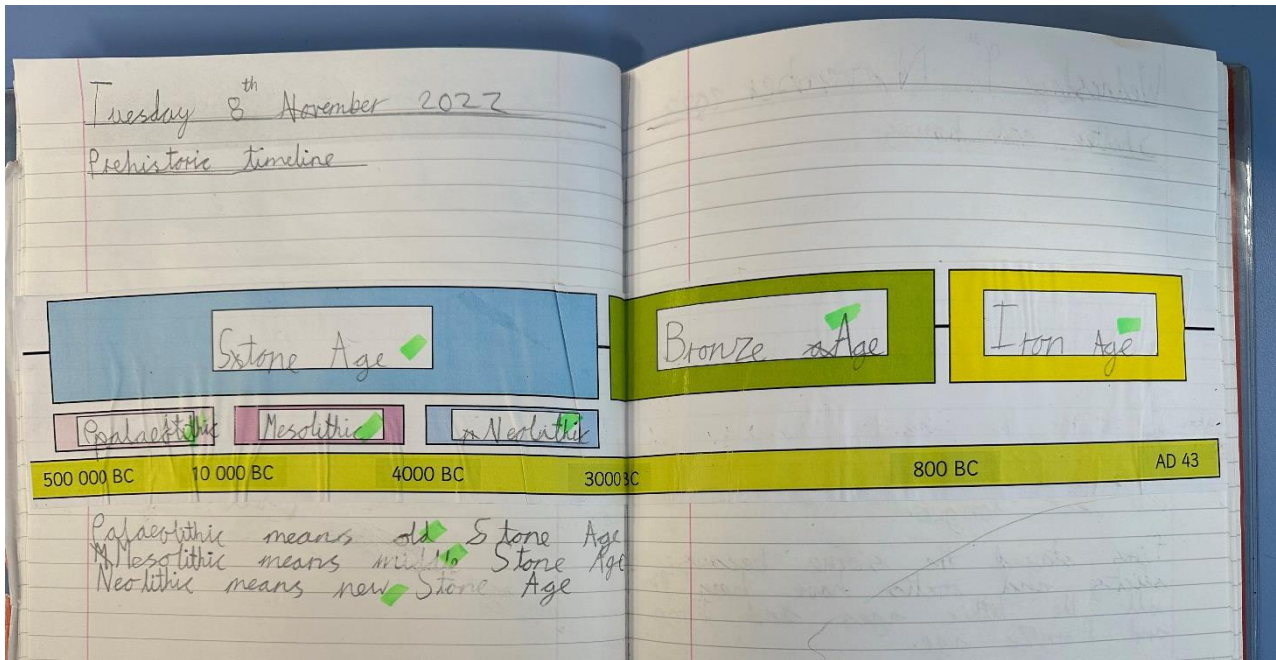
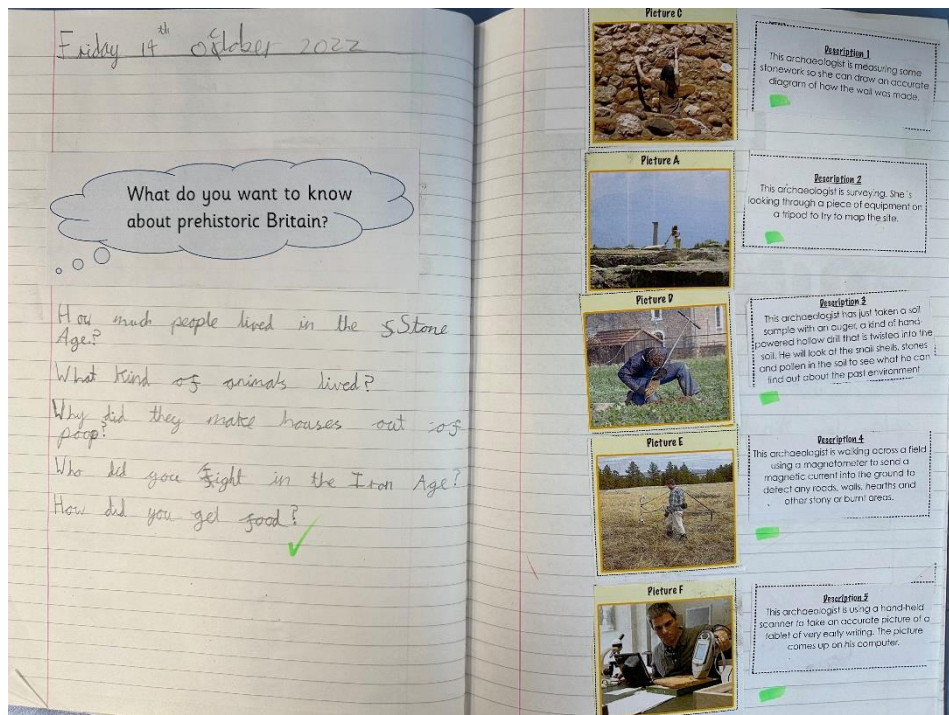


Y4 Honeybees Enquiry based learning photo story

How did shelter/houses change from the Stone Age to the Iron Age?

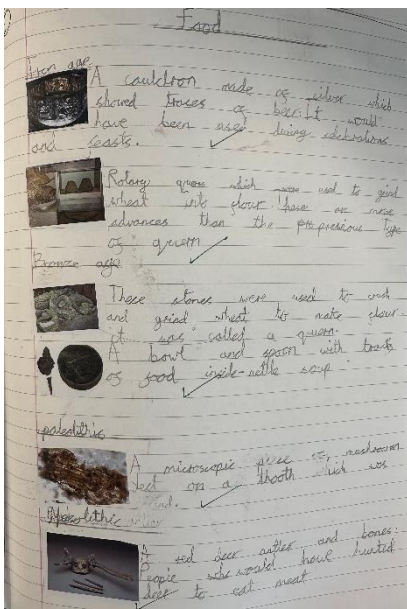
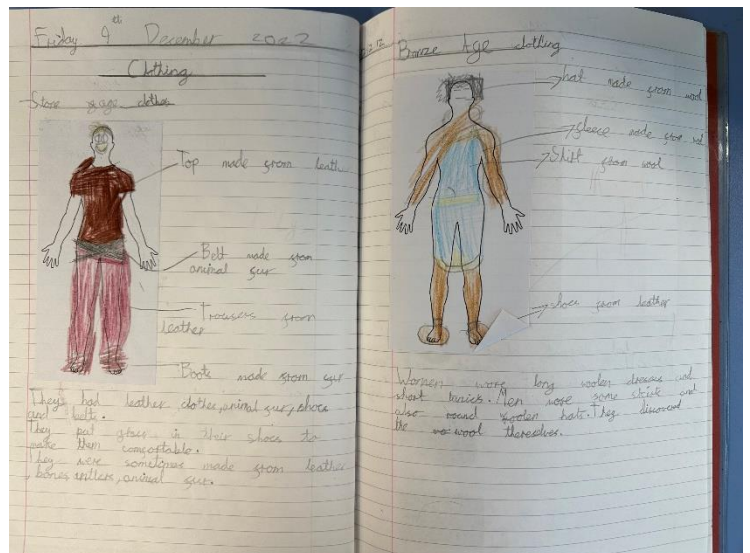

We made predictions about what each artefact might be and how it might have been used, then thought about what we can learn about life in the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age from artefact.
