#### Message from Mrs Robson

In September there will be some minor adjustments to how our school day runs as the Government is wanting children to be in school for at least 32.5 hours per week. This will mean some slight adjustments to start times but if your child comes to breakfast club there will be no change. A message will come out next week to confirm start times for September.

In Harmony will run in every year group next year which will mean that the school day will end at 3.30pm for different year groups on different days. Y4 and Y5 swimming will also mean they will finish on some days at 3.30pm as they do now. Information about this will come out during the first week back in September. In Harmony and swimming will start week 2.

School is open throughout the summer with a range of activities taking place so please contact the office if you want your child to attend. School fully opens again on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> September and we will send reminders to families using Dojo and texts on Monday and Tuesday of that week. We also have a training day on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> November and Monday 3rd June 2024.

# End of the school day:

3pm	Y6 from the top yard. Y2 from hall* (Penguins) and Gym (Seals), siblings from Y3-6 will leave with them. Nursery pick up time from their veranda accessed via gate on Derwent Street.
3.05pm	Y4 from the top yard. Reception pick up time from their veranda accessed via gate on Derwent Street.
3.10pm	Y3 from hall* (Tigers) and Gym (Elephants) siblings from Y4-6 will leave with them. Y5 from the top yard. Y1 pick up time from their veranda accessed via gate on Derwent Street.
*	When In Harmony starts Penguins and Tigers will leave from the link corridor.

Children who are over 8 years old can walk home alone provided parents have signed a letter giving permission. Teachers will be available for a quick chat at the end of the day but longer conversations need an appointment booked.

#### Holiday fines

Just a reminder that we need holiday forms completed for any child taking time off during term time. No holidays will be authorised and parents will be fined if their child's absence exceeds 4.5 days (which is 10 sessions or more).

# After School Club

Remember to make sure we have up to date contact numbers for you in case we have to get in touch in an emergency. We also sent text messages to keep parents informed so it is vital our contact details are up to date. We also use Dojo so please make sure you are signed up.

#### **Medical Needs**

If your child has a medical need or condition can you let the school office know so it can be recorded on our system, that way all staff who need to know will. A care plan may need to be made with the school nurse and staff may need specialised training. We also need to know any changes that may occur immediately.





All *money* paid into school should either be paid directly to the school office or through the class teacher in a labelled
