How **morals** mean being concerned with the **right and wrong behaviour** and that **moral decisions** are not always easy to make.

That it is important to **reflect** on their own beliefs as well as **exploring others**.



Key Vocabulary	
<b>opinion</b>	A belief that people have about something or someone that is not a fact.
<b>reflect</b>	To think carefully and deeply about something before you make a decision. Or to change your opinion about something after looking at all the facts.
<b>forgiveness</b>	Means letting go of feelings of resentment and anger towards someone.
<b>ethics</b>	Deciding what is right or wrong for an individual, group or society.
<b>morals</b>	Are the things that you believe are right or wrong e.g. how you act or treat people.
<b>principles</b>	Is a rule, belief or idea that guides you when you are making decisions.
<b>life lessons</b>	Something you learn through things you experience in life. e.g. to be patient.
<b>interpreted.</b>	To be able to understand or explain the meaning of something based on your own opinion.
