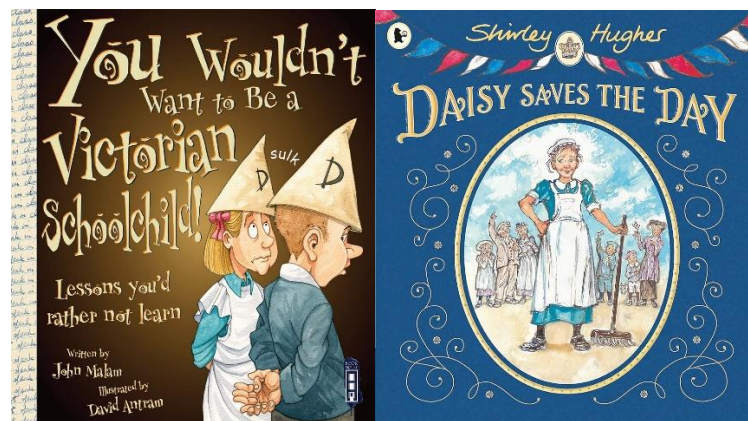

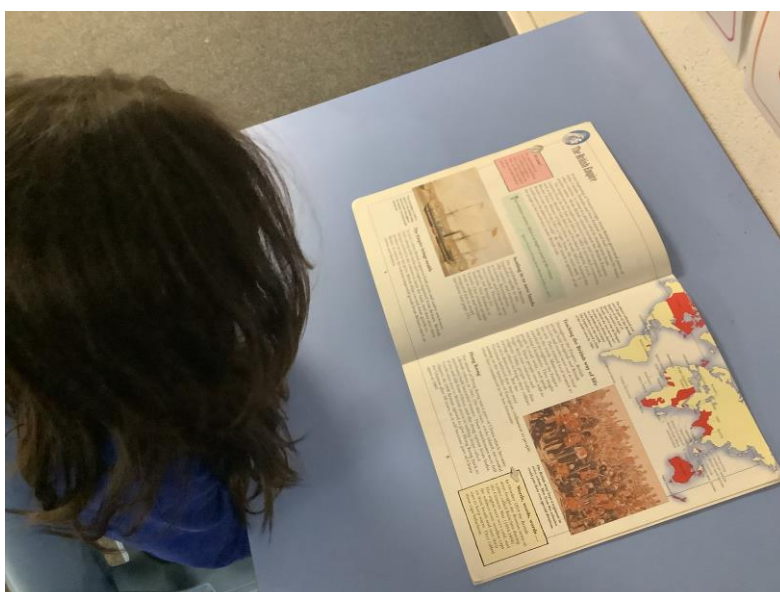

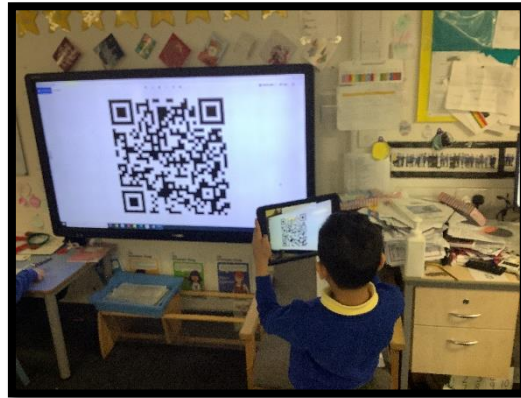

Later, we used QR codes with preprogramed webpages to find out about the teachers in Victorian schools



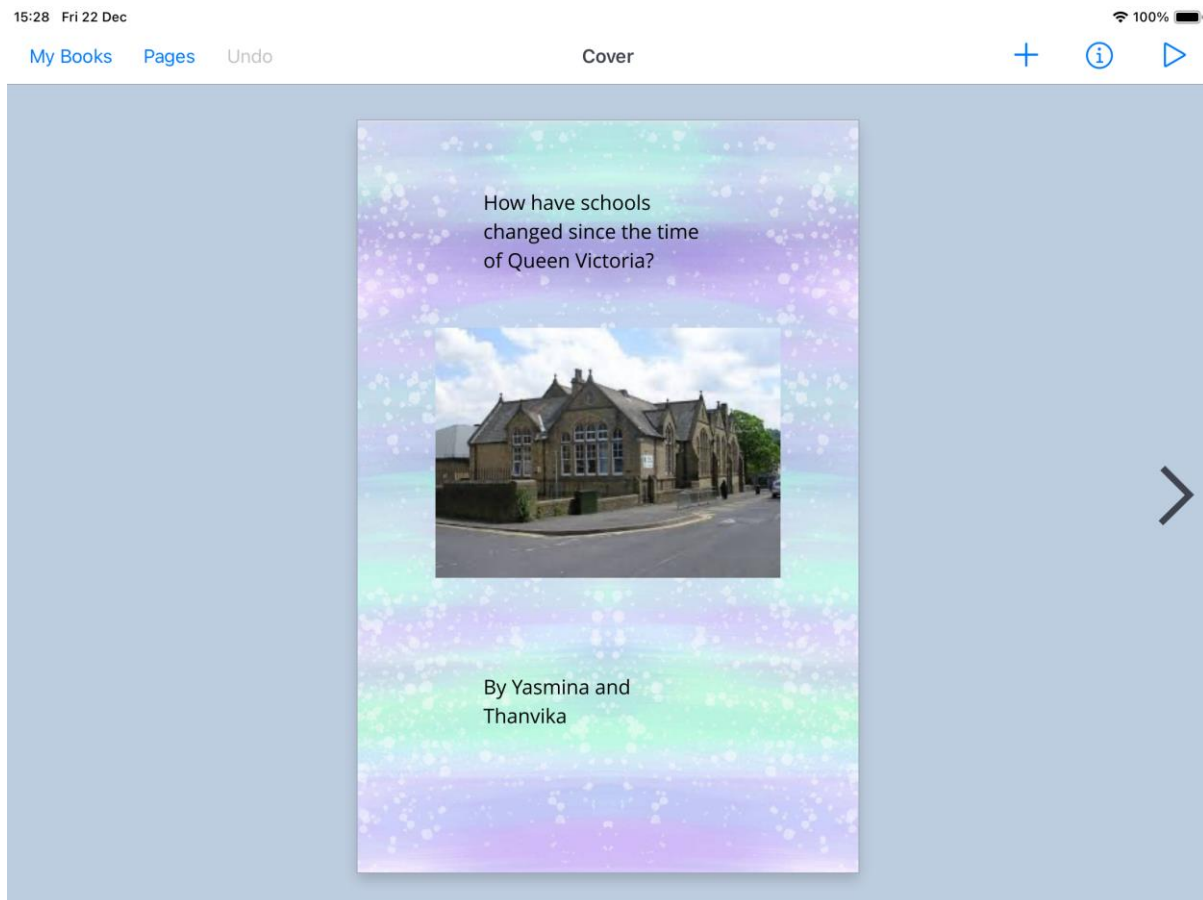
