STEMtastic!



Year 6 had an excellent STEMtastic week which is annual event for all Year 6 children in our Trust. The children took part in lots of activities

focusing on science, technology, engineering and maths. They also found out about some careers which use these subjects. The week involved a visit to the Centre for Life and the Discovery Museum where the children were set various challenges including: designing a boat, testing how much electricity they could generate, making torches, working with the RAF to create aeroplanes and visiting the planetarium. Everyone learned lots of new things and we were even praised for our incredible behaviour by a member of the public!

Red Nose Day



We enjoyed dressing in red clothes for Red Nose Day. We found out about the Comic Relief Charity and how our donations could support

people in the UK and around the world. Some of us also wore hats to show our support for Brain Tumour Research.

Y4

The Dolphins class had a trip to Jarrow Hall where there is a replica Anglo Saxon village. We also visited St Pauls Church where the Venerable Bede worshipped as a monk. There is a stained glass window made from fragments of glass that are 1365 years old!

In Year 3 Tigers we made book bags in DT and decorated them in tin foil to make them reflective. That was because we were learning about light in Science. I put my favourite shapes on. We

learned three types of stitching - running stitch, back stitch and whip stitch.

screen and then put in photos of Italy behind us. We used IMovie on the IPads to edit our videos. It was fun to do and the end videos are really good.

Year 2 enjoyed some story sessions with Dorothy and John in the library on World Book Day. Some children


have also been training as library volunteers to learn all about the library system and how to help put the library books away.

Holiday fines

Attendance and Punctuality

Can I please remind all adults that the school and grounds is a no smoking zone and no one is allowed to smoke in this area. In fact it is illegal and anyone caught can face prosecution. Thank you for your support in this.



Peer Massage

Peer massage is part of our wellbeing provision for the children and we have a fabulous sensory room for

children to go to chill out and de-stress.

A huge thank you to all our volunteers who help around school we really do appreciate your time.



After School Club

In our after school childcare the children have the opportunity to do fun activities, have a snack and there is time to get their homework done too. If you are interested in applying for a place for your child please see the school office.

Remember to make sure we have up to date contact numbers for you in case we have to get in touch in an emergency. We also sent text messages and Dojo messages to keep parents informed so it is vital our contact details are up to date.

Medical Needs

If your child has a medical need or condition can you let the school office know so it can be recorded on our system, that way all staff who need to know will. A care plan may need to be made with the school nurse and staff may need specialised training. We also need to know any changes that may occur immediately.

When getting medication for your child to be given in school from a doctor or pharmacist please ensure there is a label attached showing your child's name, the date and dosage.



All **money** paid into school should either be paid directly to the school office or through the class teacher in a labelled

envelope. This prevents any loss or confusion over money paid.
