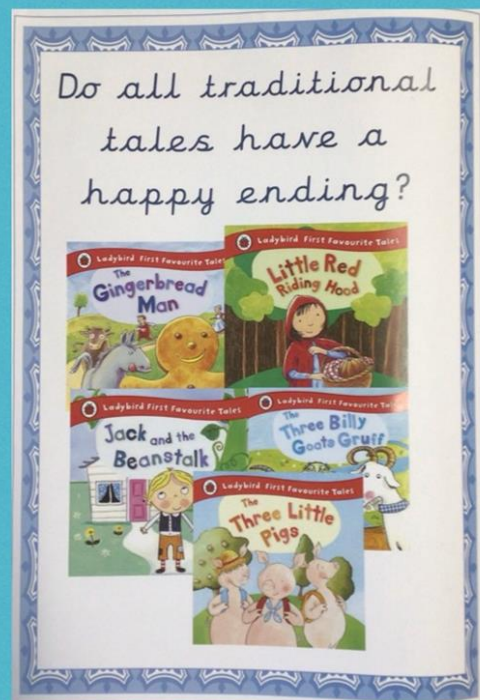

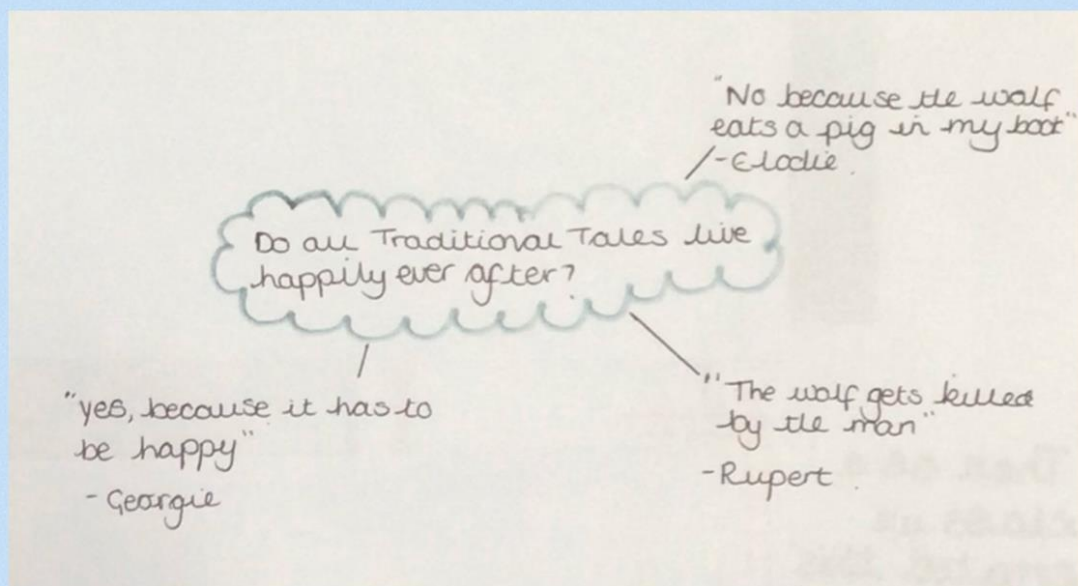

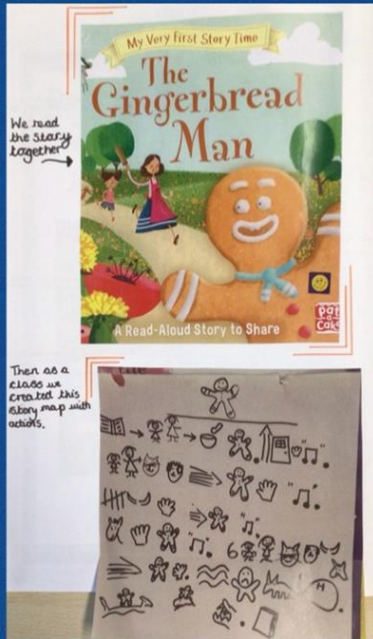

Children's responses were noted



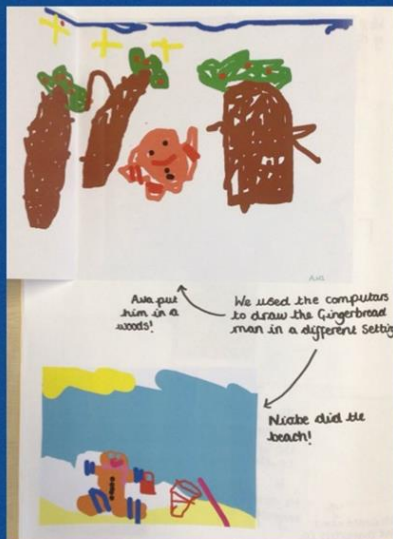
We read *The Gingerbread Man* before creating a story map to orally retell.



We measured the height of Gingerbread men using non standard units.

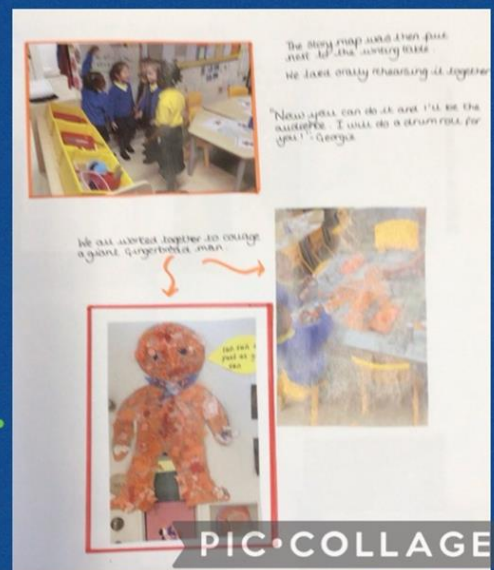


We retold the story using small world.

We used freeze frames.

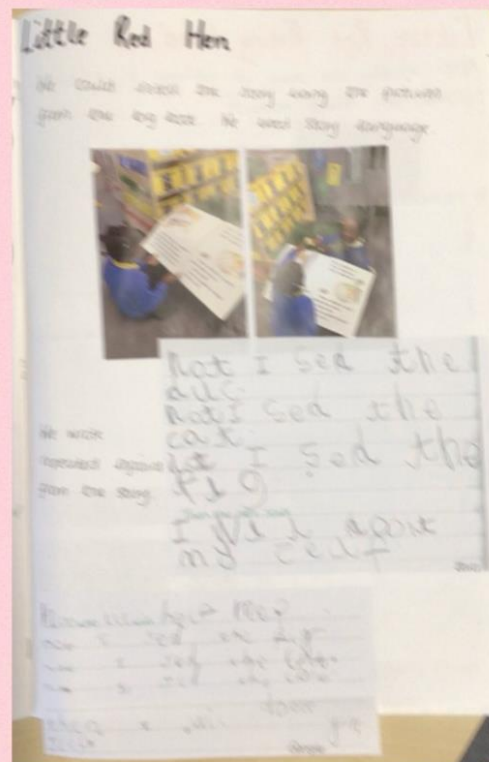


We became the angry giant!

We created a story map to retell the story.

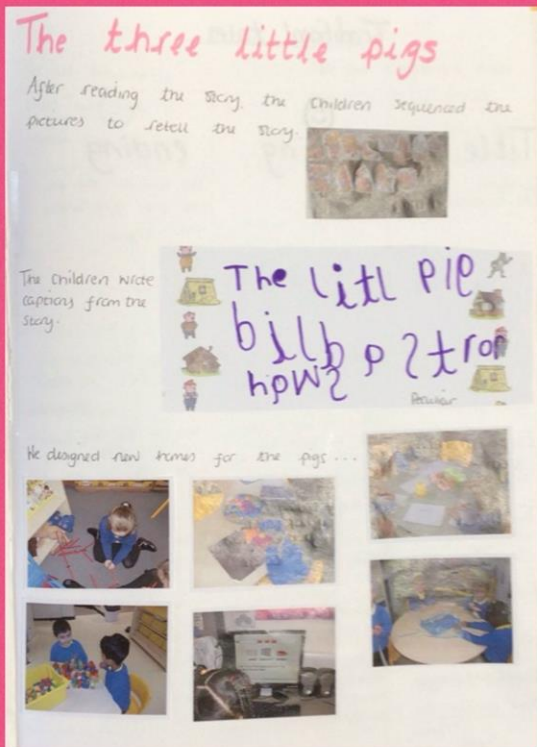
We used puppets to retell.

We worked in groups listening to each others ideas.

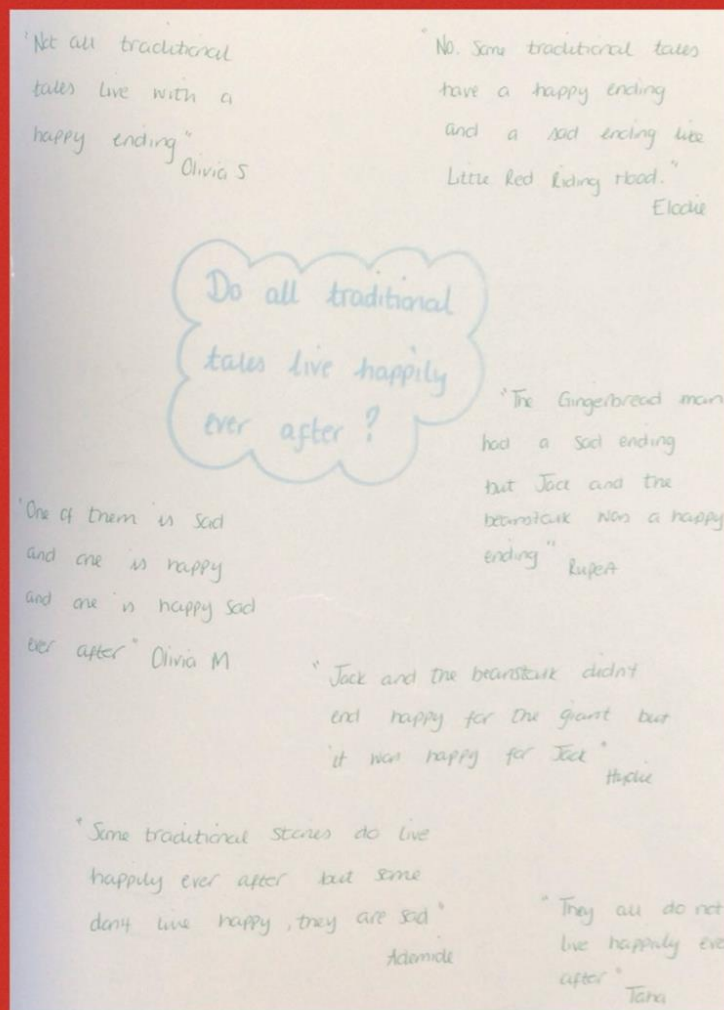
After reading a selection of traditional tales, we discussed what we liked and disliked about each story.

Three Billy Goats Gruff	"Happy because they crossed the bridge for the yummy green grass" Olivia	
Hansel and Gretel	"A happy ending because Hansel and Gretel escaped and got food and flowers to stay with home" Angel
