We visited the Centre for Life and did a carousel of activities. Charlie and Esref are our champion jet makers and longest distance flight champions. We explored wind turbines to generate electricity. We tried to solve a crime We had a day at the Discovery museum too

The children enjoyed celebrating World Book Day. They came to school dressed as their favourite book character or in an outfit representing an adjective (a



describing word). Each child received a book token to spend on one of the World Book Day books. This was a great opportunity to promote a love of reading!

Our KS2 children performed the Glasshouse this week for their parents with Hawthorn Primary School. They were all absolutely amazing and what an opportunity to attend such an amazing venue.



Year 2 had an **online safety** session and we learned all about how to stay safe online. We discussed who our trusted adults are and how to stay safe online when playing games.



Year 2 visited the **Discovery Museum** this term linked with their enquiry based learning question 'Why did the Great Fires spread so quickly?' We learned more about the Great Fire of Newcastle and Gateshead and explored some artefacts from the Victorian period. We also used puppets to act out what happened, which was great fun.

For the **WEST Maths Trust Day**, Year 4 Honeybees looked at a book with lots of



mathematical facts linked to distances. We used calculators to work out how many kangaroo hops it would take to cross Australia. We then measured the lengths of some of our jumps and worked out how many of our jumps it would take.

Year 4 Jarrow Hall visit



Year 4 Honeybees & Dolphins loved visiting Jarrow Hall to develop their knowledge about the Anglo Saxons. We learnt how to use a loom to weave wool to create a piece of fabric. We explored the farm to learn about

village life and took part in a battle!



We walked around the living village/farm, met the animals and discussed how they would

live, farm and eat back then. We got to see and feel how their homes would be, as well as their lives.



We loved having a fire in the large hut and hearing legend stories such as

Beowulf. (We've been reading this in English so it was very exciting!)



In our **Art lessons**, the Year 4 Honeybees enjoyed learning about Norwegian artist Edvard Munch. We recreated our own

version of his famous painting 'The Scream', thinking carefully about which colours to use to portray a feeling or mood.

0-3 trip to the Farm



Our 0-3 children went to Bill Quay farm to see all the animals and had a great time.

Developing oracy

All of our children are developing their speaking and listening skills using resources and support from **Voice21**. We have key staff in school who are Oracy Champions and children in all classes are working hard to develop these skills.



School Council

Our School Council helped to judge the Easter egg completion this year. They have also visited the Lord Major and helped make a video with our Trust Schools to celebrate 10 years of the West End Schools' Trust.

Holiday fines

Just a reminder that we need holiday forms completed for any child taking time off during term time. No holidays will be authorised and parents will be fined if their child's absence exceeds 4.5 days (which is 10 sessions or more).

We are also part of Newcastle's West End Children's Community working with all partners in the west end to support children cradle to career.

Attendance and Punctuality

After School Club

In our after school childcare the children have the opportunity to do fun activities, have a snack and there is time to get their homework done too. If you are interested in applying for a place for your child please see the school office.



Medical Needs

If your child has a medical need or condition can you let the school office know so it can be recorded on our system, that way all staff who need to know will. A care plan may need to be made with the school nurse and staff may need specialised training. We also need to know any changes that may occur immediately.

When getting medication for your child to be given in school from a doctor or pharmacist please ensure there is a label attached showing your child's name, the date and dosage.



All **money** paid into school should either be paid directly to the school office or through the class teacher in a labelled envelope. This prevents any loss or confusion over money paid.


