During autumn term Year 5 have been learning about the artist Beatrix Milhaze, who is a Brazilian artist whose work is inspired by the rainforest including lots of nature shapes and vivid colours. Year 5 have worked with a local artist to create a nature inspired collage visiting Belsay hall to take their own nature images to include in their own art. The children created a collage using shapes from nature and adding their own collected photos as a focus point inspired by the works of Beatrix Milhaze.

As part of our R.E, we have been learning about the 5 Pillars of Islam and what happens in a mosque. We had the opportunity to visit a local mosque and

speak to the Iman, who welcomed us to his place of worship. We enjoyed learning about how Muslims pray and had lots of enquiring questions.
